COURAGE WHEN THE WIND RISES

The disciples meet Jesus in the darkness, walking toward them across the water. Peter steps out in trust, then begins to sink when fear becomes louder than the Lord's voice. This Gospel does not praise recklessness; it reveals the steady courage born from keeping our eyes on Christ. When uncertainty rises this week, we can pray honestly, accept a helping hand, and take the next faithful step.

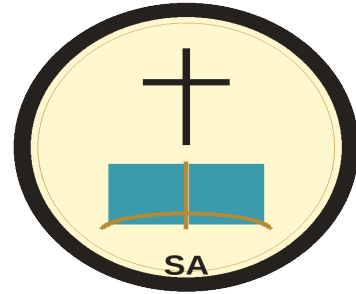

BIOGRAPHY: MOST REV. MATEO ANDRÉS CALDERÓN, O.F.M. CAP. BISHOP OF THE DIOCESE OF NORTH LAKE

Bishop Mateo Andrés Calderón was born in 1968 in Mesa Vista, the fourth of six children of parents who built their new life around family, parish, and service. He was baptized at St. Gabriel Church and attended local Catholic schools, where teachers first encouraged his interest in Scripture, music, and care for people living at the margins.

After two years of university study, he entered the Capuchin Franciscan formation program in 1988. He completed undergraduate work in philosophy, professed first vows in 1991, and later earned graduate degrees in theology and pastoral ministry. His years of formation included service in shelters, rural missions, hospital chaplaincy, and parish catechesis. He professed solemn vows in 1994 and was ordained a priest in 1996.

Father Calderón's first assignments brought him to multilingual parishes in the Southwest. He helped train lay catechists, expanded homebound ministry, and worked with neighborhood organizations serving migrant families. A later mission assignment took him overseas for seven years, where he learned a local language and collaborated with village leaders to develop schools, clean-water projects, and formation programs for parish ministers.

Returning to the United States, he completed advanced studies in spirituality and served as director of formation for his religious community. From 2012 to 2018 he was pastor of a large urban parish whose weekend liturgies were celebrated in four languages. Parishioners remember his emphasis on reverent worship, shared leadership, and practical care for families experiencing grief, unemployment, or displacement.

In 2019 he was elected to his province's leadership council and later became provincial vicar. In that role, he accompanied friars in parish, educational, and missionary assignments, supervised safeguarding and formation work, and strengthened partnerships between religious communities and diocesan offices.

The Holy Father appointed Father Calderón bishop of North Lake in spring 2026. His episcopal ordination was celebrated at Holy Family Cathedral with representatives from parishes, religious communities, schools, and charitable ministries throughout the region. He chose the motto "Walk in Charity" as a reminder that Christian teaching becomes visible through humble service.

As bishop, he has identified four early priorities: forming missionary disciples, strengthening Catholic education, caring for priests and parish leaders, and building a culture in which children and vulnerable adults are protected. He hopes to visit every parish during his first two years and to listen closely to communities in both urban and rural areas.

Bishop Calderón speaks English and Spanish and continues to study the languages represented in his diocese. He enjoys sacred music, woodworking, and visiting parish schools. He asks the faithful to pray that his ministry will help every community encounter Christ, deepen communion, and serve neighbors with courage and tenderness.

COURAGE WHEN THE WIND RISES\nA Sunday Reflection on the Gospel

Matthew 14:22-33 · Jesus comes across the water and calls his friends from fear into trust.

Night on the lake turns an ordinary crossing into a place of fear. The disciples cannot yet recognize the figure coming toward them, and the wind makes every uncertainty feel larger. Jesus speaks before he changes the conditions: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Faith often begins in the same way. We may not receive an immediate solution, but we receive a presence strong enough to help us take the next step.

Peter's courage is real, even though it is incomplete. He leaves the boat because he trusts the voice of Jesus. Then he notices the wind, loses focus, and begins to sink. His prayer is brief and honest: "Lord, save me." Jesus reaches for him at once. The Gospel does not shame a disciple for needing help. It teaches us to call out, accept the hand offered, and begin again with greater humility.

Our own storms may be grief, conflict, illness, financial pressure, or a decision whose outcome we cannot control. Courage is not pretending the wind is absent. It is keeping Christ at the center while we act with patience and love. This week, name one fear in prayer. Ask one trusted person for help. Take one faithful action. Even a small step can become an act of worship when it is taken with Jesus.

FAITH FORMATION

Sunday formation for grades K-8 meets from 9:30 AM-noon during the school year. Confirmation and youth formation follow the published calendar. First Communion and Christian initiation require advance registration.

SAFE MINISTRY

Clergy, employees, and volunteers serving minors or vulnerable adults must complete diocesan screening and current training before ministry begins. Report suspected abuse to civil authorities first, then follow the diocesan reporting policy. Visit diocese.example.org/safe-ministry.

HOLY ORDERS AND CONSECRATED LIFE

Anyone discerning priesthood, the diaconate, religious life, or consecrated service may speak confidentially with a priest or contact the diocesan vocation office at vocations@diocese.example.org.

INFANT BAPTISM

Parents should contact faith formation before choosing a date. Preparation, parish registration, and godparent documentation must be complete before the celebration is scheduled. Children who have reached catechetical age follow the parish initiation process.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION

Engaged couples should meet with a priest before publishing a date and at least six months before the hoped-for wedding. Preparation normally includes parish meetings, required documentation, and diocesan formation. Contact marriage@stanselmjuniper.example.org.

FUNERAL LITURGIES
